

Spring Mountain Race Track Driving Instruction By Bob Crane, 2014

I was to be given two days of driving instruction in 2014 Corvettes for only \$1000. I told my friend Allen Morris that I didn't think they were giving me anything. He said that I would probably use up \$1000 in tires during those two days. So, I took the driving instruction at the Ron Fellows Performance Driving School at Spring Mountain, which included a one-night stay in their onsite condos. During my two days of instruction I drove cars exactly like mine: Z51, Performance exhaust, Magnetic shocks, and automatic paddle shift transmission. I learned how to drive quickly around cones, control spin outs on wet roads, and bake and downshift going into curves. I spent the second day driving on the track. When approaching a curve, I learned to look where I want to go, not where I'm going. Check out the enclosed picture. It was a fantastic experience. I'm now more comfortable driving my car. I am going back to Spring Mountain in April as part of a NCCC convention in Las Vegas. I'll get to drive my car on their track. What great fun.

Modern classic: Have a new 1950s Chevy built to order

So you like the looks of the classic cars flowing up and down Woodward Avenue, but you're hooked on the modern reliability and convenience?

Let me introduce you to Chris Sondles. He'll build you a brand-new 1955, 1956 or 1957 Chevy, or sell you the parts to make your own.

"We're building a '55 convertible right now that has an adaptive suspension, eight-speed automatic transmission and the 680-hp V8 engine from a 2016 Cadillac CTS-V" performance sedan, Sondles said.

"It'll look like a '55, but I dare any modern sports car to pull up next to it and challenge the owner."

A hobbyist who wants to buy a kit can build his or her own car for \$40,000-\$45,000. Prices for finished cars start at \$75,000 and end wherever the owner runs out of imagination.

The 1955-57 Chevys — insiders call them the Tri-Fives, because they shared parts and their basic engineering — are among today's most popular collector cars. Like the Ford Model T and the Ford Deuce Coupe that

preceded them, when new they were plentiful, inexpensive and durable. All were popular middle-class family cars in their day.

"These cars have taken their place at the head of the table among American collector cars," Sondles said. "They're the Little Deuce Coupe of the 21st Century, but with new technology we offer, they ride and drive as good as a new car.

You can order a car as simple as the original were — AM radio, just add fuzzy dice — or you can have all the comforts of a new car — USB ports, antilock brakes, modern air-conditioning and cup holders for your 21st-Century latte or energy drink.

All the new cars have a modern GM drivetrain and warranty, courtesy of Sondles' license from Chevrolet Performance Parts. A brand-new 420-horsepower 6.1-liter Chevy small-block V8 is the most frequently ordered engine.

About 10 people build the cars.
