



A Brief History of the 1958 Chevrolet Impala, By Robert Tate, Automotive Historian and Researcher

One of the most popular General Motors nameplates over its history is the Chevrolet Impala. The Impala story started back in 1956, when Chevrolet introduced a great looking show car at the GM Motorama show called the Impala. The show car offered a fiberglass body and became a big hit with consumers who enjoyed its great styling.

When the Chevrolet Impala was made available to the public in 1958, General Motors had a huge success on their hands. Most consumers enjoyed its great design and many of its new added features. It was a brand new design for Chevrolet. The 1958 Chevrolet models were designed under the legendary Harley Earl. It was the first Chevrolet model that offered dual headlamps and triple taillights.

I always thought that the 1958 Chevrolet models were the best looking cars made that year. In 1959 and 1960, Chevrolet continued to be among the sales leaders in the automotive market, with models that were more radical featuring a bat-wing tail design. However, one of the nicest looking models in the Chevrolet line was the Impala Sport Coupe, which attracted many buyers.

A brief story of Chris Tooley's '57 Bel Air Coupe

My parents decided in the Summer of 1981 in Syracuse, NY to add a third vehicle for the family because three of us four children were working and we needed more vehicles for transportation options. I just turned 17. My father came home on a Saturday afternoon and asked me if I wanted to go to the local dealership to look at a car. When we came back home with a '57 Chevy (after buying it for \$2,500) my mother wasn't very happy. She was thinking, Who would be able to drive it?

In time it was either my father or me that would use it. He was stranded multiple times because of numerous mechanical issues. I would regularly take care of it and spent personal money upgrading the car as a teenager. I would drive the car to & from High School and went to my Senior Ball in it. Everywhere I went the car was such a conversation piece. It saw some snow in the early Spring & late Fall's. I stored it in a barn during the snowy mid-winters. Many times, during and after my college years my father wanted me to sell the car. I was financially struggling like many young adults. He would say, "Later in your life they'll be a-dime-a-dozen".

Before I drove across the country in 1990 to move to California, my father traded me the car for a snowmobile I had. It was about the amount he said that he had into it. I had the car on an open car carrier in the Summer of 1998 to be transported to my home in Norco, CA. The next three years I did a complete frame-off restoration. Mechanicals first, then all the body work, interior, etc. We got lucky - the frame is the One-Piece Seamless with the Coupe (no post) body. The original paperwork says the car came from South Carolina and built at the Van Nuys GM plant. It made its way back home in CA! I replaced the V8 283 for a 383. I gave a lot of thought before and during the restoration about the correct pieces adding to the car. Also, what not to put on it. Still a work-in-progress. Ideas change over time

The car to me has always been about fun. Enjoying the driving experience, along with selected showing. Coincidently, I'm now 57 years old and have owned the Bel Air for 40 years now. I'm excited to build new memories with the car!



From Wikipedia, the free encyclopedia, *The 1957 Chevrolet* is a car that was introduced by Chevrolet in September 1956 for the 1957 model year. It was available in three series models: the upscale Bel Air, the mid-range Two-Ten, and the One-Fifty. A two-door station wagon, the Nomad, was produced as a Bel Air model. An upscale trim option called the Delray was available for Two-Ten 2-door sedans. It is a popular and sought after classic car. These vehicles are often restored to their original condition and sometimes modified. The car's image has been frequently used in toys, graphics, music, movies, and television. The '57 Chevy, as it is often known, is an auto icon.[2]

Initially, General Motors executives wanted an entirely new car for 1957, but production delays necessitated the 1955–56 design for one more year.[3] Ed Cole, chief engineer for Chevrolet, dictated a series of changes that significantly increased the cost of the car. These changes included a new dashboard, sealed cowl, and the relocation of air ducts to the headlight pods, which resulted in the distinctive chrome headlight that helped make the '57 Chevrolet a classic. Fourteen-inch wheels replaced the fifteen-inch wheels from previous years to give the car a lower stance, and a wide grille was used to give the car a wider look from the front. The now famous '57 Chevrolet tailfins were designed to duplicate the wide look in the rear. Bel Air models, though maintaining the same chassis, powertrains, and body, were given upscale gold trim: the mesh grille insert and front fender chevrons, as well as the "Chevrolet" script on the hood and trunk, were all rendered in anodized gold. The 1957 Chevrolets did not have an oil pressure gauge or a voltmeter.[4] The base engine was an inline 6-cylinder called the Blue Flame Six. The engine was smoother running than the V-8. Carburetion came from a single one-barrel carburetor.
