Fellow Chevy Lovers_

Our next meeting will be 2 days after our car show Oct. 10 at Enderle Center in Tustin. I thought this would be good time to talk about all the work that goes on behind the scenes and what it really takes to put on our annual VCCA car show. As you know we did not have a car show last year because of the pandemic and were expecting a large turnout this year. So far, the registration numbers have not been that great, but it seems people often wait until the last minute to register. Maybe this year it is because things are so unpredictable and there are still concerns regarding the Delta Virus-Covid 19.

Jim Karris, car show chairman starts his duties early in the year. He first must make sure we have a date, approved by Enderle and on their calendar. Then he must contact national VCCA to make sure we have insurance for the event and puts the event date, time, location in the G & D.

Jim works with Mark Wilk (designer extraordinaire) on the artwork for the flyers, t-shirt, trophies and directory for the show. Art work for the shows has been done for many years by Mark Wilk. Every year Mark starts from scratch to create all new images which he hand draws. He then adds colors and detail to make them perfect. When doing the artwork, he put it into a special program to get sent out for printing. We are so fortunate to have him, such a talented artist, as a longtime member of our region.

After the artwork is done Jim orders the flyers. We pass them out to the members and car community at large. At this point at least two car show meeting dates are set up to assure that all needs for the day of the show are met with members assigned to various duties. The duties on the agenda fill a whole sheet of 8 X 11 paper typed in small print. Once the flyers are distributed the registration chair begins her work to set up an Excel file with numerous sheets including all details needed to tract information, names, car year, type with color, number & size of t-shirts, those requesting judging, opportunity & 5050 tickets ordered, phone numbers, email addresses, etc. Checks or cash for registration is forwarded to Tom Clark for processing and banking, He then preps the cash boxes for the day of the show. About 3 weeks prior to the show Sabrina orders the t-shirt.

Next, Jim works with Mike Sherman, head Judge, and other members to plan for coverage of needed judges for the show. After that, I work with Connell Chevrolet to assure they are on board to pay for the trophies. We have been very fortunate that Connell Chevrolet has for many years paid this expense. Once all that is clarified I order the awards for the show.

Sabrina prints the window cards for the cars and car categories pages for parking the cars day of the show. Prior to the day of the show the window cards, tickets ordered and other things are put into envelopes for the day of the show. Susan Hergenreter is incharge of the Opportunity table and 50/50 drawing. Please bring your contibutions to the show. Gary
