



Chevrolet Four Cylinder Tour by Rich P < rapsjc@aol.com >

I just got back from the Four Cylinder Tour of the VCCA, (May 1-May 6 th). The base location was Porterville, with visits to Tom Meleo's collection in Lindsay, Springville, the Blain collection of 1911 National Indianapolis race cars, 200 mile plus round trip, up to Hume Lake in Kings Canyon. Sequoia (up narrow twisting roads, almost one car wide). The last day of the tour was a visit to the Strathmore museum and The Zalud home. The home is furnished in all the original furnishings of the late 1800s. It's a walk step back in time.

"IN 1891 THE ZALUD FAMILY, immigrants from Bohemia, built themselves an elaborate European-style mansion with a mansard roof, a style that was unique in the Californian city of Porterville at the time. John Zalud ran a successful saloon with a card room in the back, and his bets in some high-stakes card games paid off. But in 1912 their fortunes began to change.





"The family endured an unlikely string of tragedies, and this sad history has been preserved in a small museum at the old house, which has long been rumored to be haunted."

All the cars on tour were Four cylinder Chevrolets, 1914-1928. I now have even more respects for these little wonders, after seeing them travel the back roads up steep winding roads to see the trees of Sequoia, including the

Frustrated and a little embarrassed she leaned into the microphone and simply said, 'I'm sorry I'm so jittery. I gave up beer for Lent and this whiskey is killing me! I'll never get my speech back in order so let me just tell you what I know.'

As we laughed, she cleared her throat and began,

' We do not stop playing

because we are old; we grow old because we stop playing.

There are only four secrets to staying young, being happy, and achieving success.

You have to laugh and find humor every day.

You've got to have a dream. When you lose your dreams, you die.

We have so many people walking around who are dead and don't even know it!

There is a huge difference between growing older and growing up.

If you are nineteen years old and lie in bed for one full year and don't do one productive thing, you will turn twenty years old.

If I am eighty-seven years old and stay in bed for a year and never do anything I will turn eighty-eight.

Anybody! Can grow older. That doesn't take any talent or ability.


