"BEAST" A 1955 CHEVY BEL AIR

Owned by Valarie Miranda-Lopez

any cars look like they are meant to be in a car magazine, and some just need to be shared. They aren't perfect in every way, but they have a rich story behind them. Valarie Miranda-Lopez's 1955 Chevy Bel Air 4-door is a huge part of her family's history.

Valarie's grandparents purchased a brand-new Coral and Shadow Grey 1955 Bel Air 4-door in Anaheim, California, when her mother was just 10 years old. Valarie's mother had such fond memories of the car from her childhood that long after the original car was gone, she purchased a 1955 in 1979 for \$250 so her own family could make similar memories. She bought the car from the second owner, located locally in Fullerton, CA. In 1979 the then 24-year-old car was just a ugly old used car to most. The paint needed to be redone, the interior needed freshening up and the 235 six cylinder, backed by a Powerglide, was showing its age. Yet the memories this old Chevy would provide this family over the next 45 years were not yet realized.





oon after acquiring the car Valarie's mother sent the car to Classic Wheels in Anaheim, California where they took it apart and repaired the bumps and bruises it has earned since rolling off the assembly line

before painting it back to its original factory color combination. At the time this was a huge commitment as she spent \$5000 to bring the car's exterior and interior back to its former glory, and in 1979 that was a year's wages for her.

Sadly, when Valarie's dad passed in 1983, at the age of 39, her mother began driving the car as her daily driver at the time. Young 16-year-old Valarie learned to drive in the car which was quite challenging as it had manual steering and manual brakes. She conquered the task easily and then drove the car on special occasions during her high school years, including her prom!

ith times changing and Valarie growing up, her mother passed the car onto Valarie in 1985 and she used it as her wedding limo in 1989 and then as her daily driver until 1991. During that period of time, she and the ole '55 had many adventures, including two different

harrowing experiences when the single master cylinder brake system failed, and the brake pedal went to the floor! One of those times, Valarie literally jumped out of the car and held onto the door post for two and half blocks to stop the car. Fortunately, her quick thinking helped save the car from a collision.

When asked what the most "unique" feature of the car is Valarie answered. "The car has been in our family for 45 years, I took my drivers test in it, went to senior prom and used it as our wedding limo in 1989". Talking about this '55 like a family member. It's a rolling tribute to family memories spanning four generations.

Once Valarie and her husband Salvador raised their boys, they decided to uncover the old '55 and get her back on the road. Over the next five years, the couple, with some help from some friends, got the 4-door updated, safe and ready to make more memories.

he original plan was to pull out the tired 6-cylinder and replace it with a small block 350, but a friend came up with a 5.3 LS3 instead, and the decision was made that if they were going to update the car why not really update it. A FITech Fuel Injection Management

controller was used as well as adding a Vintage Air Gen IV unit to keep the cabin cool for memory making! The engine is backed by a GM 4L60E transmission, and the exhaust breathes freely through ceramic coated headers and 2.5' exhaust system installed by Anchor Muffler.

Tuning was left to Lenny at Geared for Speed where they also installed the trailer hitch and the trans cooler to pull their recently purchased 1955 Shasta Trailer. Bud Lakeman and son at Lakeman Chassis helped with the wiring and the chassis set up. John at J&S Gear cut down a 1978 Z-28 rear end and installed new 373 gears to get the power down and not kill the gas mileage. CPP tubular spindles, QA1 shocks and 4-link rear suspension upgrade gave the old ride a new feel. CPP 10' power front disks assure the brakes will do their job when called upon. The Lopez's took the family sedan to Irwindale to do some test and tune and ran a 9.99 in the 1/8th which is a solid time for such a heavy caron 7' Coker American Classic tires and sporting True Spoke 72 Series wires!





he cabin of the Lopez's '55 was updated with a completely new stereo system installed by Fernando Garcia, while Dave at LS Upholstery redid the entire interior and trunk using coral vinyl and grey tweed.

A set of Dakota Digital VHX gauges were installed to update the look from stock while also operating fully electronically. Tri-5 Classics' Roy and Bob replaced and tinted all the glass and Frank at Decked Out Restoration cleaned up some issues in the body and then coated them with some classic red-oxide primer for an old school looking repair job before clear coating the entire car to preserve the 45-year-old paint that Valarie's mother had sacrificed for in 1979.



or Valarie's '55 this story is long from over, she and Salvador have already been to Tri-Five Nationals in Bowling Green KY the last two years and are going to be part of the Tri-Five Nationals or BUST Road Trip from Dallas to Bowling Green 2024. The Lopez's plan is to make more memories with the other 29 couples who will be on the trip.
